Rabbi's Message

How should leaders act? We see a number of examples in our textual traditions. Pharaoh treats the Jews badly and God sends plagues upon Egypt. Solomon is wise, but also acquires more and more for himself. Samuel discourages the people from placing too much power in a single ruler. We have Moses, who tries to do too much, after being reticent to lead at all at first. Then we have Joseph who both demonstrates how to take care of the powerless and how to threaten to do them harm while also showing proper stewardship of a nation. Our texts do not really give us perfect examples of leadership.

In this election, we struggle to find them as well. Perfection doesn't exist. It would be nice for us to have an array of perfect candidates in both parties, but the reality is that even in our holy texts, our leaders were not perfect. No candidate is going to be perfect. That said, even though we know this to be true, we have a tendency toward blindness toward and zealotry for the candidate whom we support. Zeal may well lead us to say things to our friends, and potentially about our friends, that we might later regret.

While we may not be able to promote civility in debates, especially not when the opposite produces ratings and jumps in the polls, let us strive to promote civility in our own discourses.

Enjoy the political discussions and debates. Participate in the Caucus. Just remember this reminder from Yom Kippur Day: *Words are like feathers spilled from a pillow into the wind: easy to disperse, perhaps impossible to collect again.*

President's Comments

On November 23rd a memorial ceremony was held here at the Temple commemorating the 30th anniversary of the deadly plane crash that held the Iowa State University Women's Cross Country track team which happened caddy corner from the Temple on Country Club. Remaining members of the team, leaders of Dam to Dam, architects from RDG, members of the Waterbury neighborhood, along with our Rabbi Kaufmann and Ira Lacher participated in a moving tribute to the lives that were lost. Hundreds of people were in attendance to remember the lives lost.

The Temple was approached last year to enter a discussion about creating a permanent memorial for these lost lives. The connection was made through Stacie Franklin as her brother ran with those who were interested in creating the memorial. Not only did Stacie have a connection, but after learning more about the crash, our own Dr. Robert Gitchell, of blessed memory, was the team doctor and was asked to come to Des Moines from Ames to identify the bodies. After much discussion and involvement as to where the memorial would be placed and how the memorial would be maintained an agreement was made to host the memorial on a small corner of our lot facing Shriver.

Not only did the Temple agree to the placement of the memorial but more importantly we were honored to have been asked to be included. It affirmed our belief that our place in this Waterbury neighborhood is not just as a place of worship for Reform Jews but an integral part of a neighborhood. The many comments that were heard from folks in the neighborhood about how the Temple is considered as much a part of their

neighborhood as their homes were heartwarming. Neighbors are watching our renovation with anticipation as much as we are (maybe because they want the dumpsters removed and the work finished) but because it confirms our commitment to the neighborhood.



In return for donating our space, RDG, the architectural group, has donated their design services in creating the landscape plan around our building and a new parking lot design that will have a better slope for water drainage so that we can avoid many of the problems that have taken place for years with regards to our Temple parking lot. Our staff and members of the Temple have been actively involved in the design process and have been included along the way. In addition, many of our congregants are runners and part of the greater Des Moines running community, and will take great pride in this tribute to the lost lives and to the sport of running in general.

It is important to me that Temple B'nai Jeshurun is considered a home for us as congregants but also part of a greater picture. An entrenched piece of a neighborhood in the heart of Des Moines that many call home. And in the near future a space to remember lives lost and to reflect on what lies ahead.
