Rabbi's Message

For some time now, there have been members of the Temple who have asked to have a Torah study that examines the weekly Torah portion and utilizes the traditional rabbinic sources. So in March, we are going to modify how we conduct Saturday mornings. Services will still begin at 10 a.m., but will end by 10:45, when we will have the "Rabbi's Torah Study."

The new Torah study will look at a selection of text from the current week's Torah portion along with rabbinical commentaries ranging from Rashi to more modern interpretations and also Midrashic commentaries. These commentaries have played an important role in the development of Jewish understanding of our texts and often help deliver meaning relevant to our modern age.



Some Saturday mornings, there will be continue to be alternative study programs including Rabbi's Tish programs, adult education programs with food, that will run from 10 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. in place of service, such as the March 26 Rabbi's Tish when we will study angels in the Jewish tradition, or shorter classes that might be in the place of the Rabbi's Torah Study. One such example of the latter is March 19, when we will discuss the upcoming Purim holiday starting at 10:45 am.

President's Comments

In Ten Minutes of Torah Rabbi Beth Kalisch was discussing the portion of Exodus 25:1-27:19 entitling her article Finding God in Large and Small Spaces. This caught my attention because of the change our physical space has taken at our Temple. While some of you are aware that our lower level has been transformed into a welcoming, accessible, and energy efficient space, the majority of our congregants have not had the chance to view the transformation. More to come on that....

While I would invite all of us to come and look at the newly renovated wing I would encourage more so that we consider how we worship in various spaces. Is it more important that we spend our worship time in our historic sanctuary or does Family Shabbat in the Social Hall suffice and create a different yet meaningful experience? When our youth attend services with their peers at camp or conclaves or at Caspe is it still a moving spiritual event? When we attend a life cycle event out of town such as a Bar Mitzvah or Wedding is it fulfilling? I argue that of course it is. It is not the environment per se but the event itself that brings meaning.

As we move forward with furnishing our renovation and ultimately moving in, is it important that we have the most beautiful furnishings over furnishings that are functional, comfortable, and long lasting? As Rabbi Kalisch asks in her D'Var Torah, "neither tiny houses nor large houses can guarantee that our homes will be

sacred spaces. Whatever space we live in, it is our responsibility to prioritize relationships over possessions, and in doing so, discover that ordinary space has the potential to become holy."



It is my belief that relationships trump everything. It is important moving forward that we treat everyone with the respect and generosity of spirit that all of us desire and deserve. Bear in mind that ALL of us are volunteers and do the best we can on behalf of the Temple. If issues arise, communicate in a way that is respectful. Do not continue to speak of issues that might be perceived as personal and thus be hurtful. It is, as Rabbi Kalisch says, our responsibility to prioritize relationships over possessions.

In terms of having a chance to view the renovation, please put April 3rd on your calendars. We have a Gala planned the likes of which have not taken place at the Temple since our 75th anniversary. The event is planned by our own Edye Beckerman and will be an opportunity for us to be together for what will be a memorable evening.

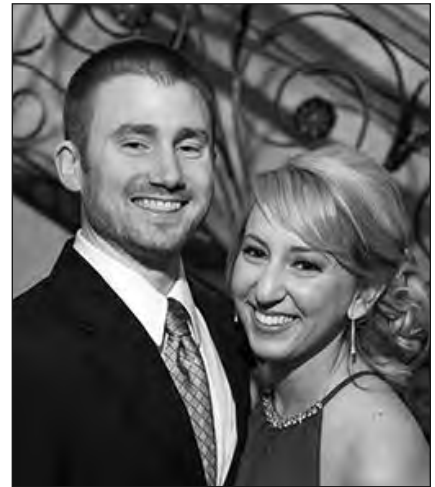
