Rabbi's Message

Often translated as "Justice, justice you shall pursue!" "Tsedek, tsedek tirdof" really means "Righteousness, righteousness you shall pursue!" The focus of the section of the Torah portion is actually on Mishpat Tsedek, "Righteous Justice," which is justice modified by righteousness. The verse "tsedek, tsedek tirdof" comes to command us to stress righteousness whenever we enact justice.

That said, Mishpat Tsedek is a broader concept. It is not just about how to judge court cases and crimes in general, not just about avoiding bias in our decision-making. It is applicable whenever we judge, period.

Mishpat Tsedek requires us to go beyond seeking solutions that fit a simple understanding. As a concept, it forces us to both look at intent and to consider humanity's imperfections. The law might expect people to always be perfect, but life just doesn't work that way and we know that it doesn't work that way for us or for anyone else.

Looking at politicians, we struggle hard with this ideal, because Mishpat Tsedek requires us to understand imperfections; that people make mistakes, that sometimes there are things more important than strictly abiding by the law, that people can try and fail without having intended to do wrong and that people who do wrong are not necessarily bad people. Not knowing something that we know doesn't make someone an idiot. Not being able to recall information while exhausted or on national television while nervous isn't a sign that they don't know it at all. Not being able to come up with the right words doesn't mean that someone believes in our interpretation of their wrong words.

We call politicians on these things often. Sometimes, we pillory them. Yes, we should expect more and better from those whom we wish to lead us and certainly from those who we wish would lead our nation than we perhaps would expect from ourselves. But expecting anyone never to make mistakes, never to not have all of the information and to make the decision that we would have made in hindsight, never to stumble over their words or use



the wrong ones, never to offend in the slightest way, even by accident, then we expect our leaders to not be human, but neither to be machines. Machines could only make decisions based on the information that they have and a programmed understanding of how to apply that information. We expect more than that. We expect some sort of divinity, a perfection of knowledge and wisdom, in intent and application.

As we approach the High Holidays along with the elections, let us remember that the Jewish tradition urges us to pursue Mishpat Tsedek and to stress righteousness, to give ourselves and others the benefit of the doubt, if you will, to judge intent as well as outcomes.

We all make mistakes, sometimes really boneheaded ones. Sometimes, we compound mistakes. It happens. We're human beings.

Our real job is to redirect ourselves. That is what Teshuvah is, turning. Turning to the right path. That is our task during the High Holidays. It's really just an application of Mishpat Tsedek, righteous justice, an understanding that we're human beings and that, at our best, we're striving toward perfection. We never actually arrive.




