### Rabbi's Message

I thought I would share my words of prayer from the inaugural prayer service for Governor Reynolds. I was one of several religious leaders who spoke including the Catholic and ELCA Bishops, Rev. Sarai Rice of DMARC, and Pastor Mike Householder of Lutheran Church of Hope.

I began by thanking Governor Reynolds and Lieutenant Governor Gregg for the honor of the invitation and Pastor Householder for his wonderful words at the Community Vigil for the Pittsburgh Synagogue Victims.

Then I added a few more thanks:

----Thank you Governor Reynolds for your strong support for the nation of Israel and the promotion of the economic and other cooperation between the state of lowa and Israel. And thank you for being there to honor and support members of the Jewish community of Iowa in times of joy and difficulty through the years. Those efforts are greatly appreciated. I especially remember the time we together honored Fred Lorber at Camp Dodge some years ago.

Then I began addressing some of our concerns:

I stand before you, a descendant of immigrants from Eastern Europe. Warfare, economic hardship, and persecution forced them to leave lands where their ancestors had lived for generations. My grandmother, as a three year old, crossed borders guided by her nine year old sister, smuggled out by beneath blankets by their mother in the back of wagon, under the cover of darkness, all afraid for their lives.

Eventually, they made it safely to America, a nation of immigrants, many of whom fled religious persecution in search of freedom. We are a nation who so prized our welcoming nature as to enshrine it on the Statue of Liberty in the words of Emma Lazarus' "New Colossus" that greeted that generation as they came to Ellis Island:

Give me your tired, your poor, Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free, The wretched refuse of your teeming shore. Send these, the homeless, tempest-tost to me, I lift my lamp beside the golden door



These words are based on the Prophet Isaiah:

Isaiah 58 This is the fast I desire: to unlock the fetters of wickedness and untie the cords of lawlessness; to let the oppressed go free and break off every yoke. It is to share your food with the wretched and take the poor into your home; When you see the naked, clothe them and do not ignore your own kin. Then will your light burst through like the dawn and your healing will spring up quickly. [When] your higher-self leads you, the weight of God is behind you. Thus [now], when you call out, God will answer; When you call out, God will say: Hineni, here I am.

lowa itself has a long history of welcoming refugees. When Iowa's Governor Bob Ray and Ambassador Ken Quinn visited the Tai Dam refugee camp in 1975 in Laos that Tai Dam leaders took their visitors from Iowa to see what they called their "Hope," found in a tent on the edge of the camp. The Iowans, expecting to be taken to some sort of religious shrine, instead found themselves looking at an Iowa Department of Transportation road map. That's Iowa. The hope of refugees.

In the holy texts of our tradition, we are repeatedly reminded to "remember the stranger." And we are commanded to love our neighbor as ourselves. May our efforts and those of the leaders of our state always help to make our state and our nation more welcoming of refugees. **Continued on next page >** 

### Rabbi's Message (continued)

The Jewish tradition tells us that when we pray to God to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, house the homeless, and lift the fallen. When we pray for God to do these things and others, God acts through us.

Our hands deliver food and clothing. Our hands build the homes. Our hands reach down and lift those who have fallen.

The Jewish people are a people who care deeply about everyone else. Caring for those who are ill and otherwise in need is a big deal for us. We are a people who see ourselves in Henny Youngman's brief joke.

"A Jewish woman had two chickens. One got sick, so the woman made chicken soup out of the other one to help the sick one get well." That is us. May our state's government always do its best to make that chicken soup as well, to provide the best healthcare options possible for the people of our state.

We are like Moses Seixas, a Jewish congregational president in Newport, Rhode Island, who wrote a letter to the first President of the United States, George Washington, checking to see if the new nation's leadership would indeed "give to bigotry no sanction, to persecution no assistance." May our government ever live up to that ideal, promoting and defending individual liberties and rights.


O God, may we all respond to the pleas of those who suffer. Help us to overcome mistrust and hatred in our highly polarized political environment. Help us to show caring for one another and to work together. May we always work to strengthen our educational system so that lowa can both teach our students the lessons of history and impart the wisdom and understanding that will lead to opportunities for success and growth.

May the efforts of our state's government bring about a better world for ourselves and for our posterity.

Linda volunteered to lead the chapel project over three years ago and has done a wonderful job in keeping the project focused and under budget. Linda's role was to make sure all of the phases of the project moved forward. Once beyond the design phase, she worked with all the contractors on the detail and instruction that was needed to get the job done without further delay. I am so grateful for Linda's leadership on this project.

The next time you visit Temple, take a moment to stop by the new chapel. We should all be very proud of our newest addition to the Mannheimer Wing. Each project of this magnitude is to ensure we have the ability to provide a sustaining Temple for many years to come. Dor L'Dor – from generation to generation. ### **Executive Director's Message**

I hope your 2019 is off to a good start. The beginning of a new calendar year is always a busy time for our office staff as we process year end donations and prepare for the necessary tax related documents for our donors and employees. I'd like to personally thank everyone that donates to the Temple and ensures the future of our congregation.

I am very happy to report that as we have come to the halfway point of our fiscal year all of our budget numbers are tracking as we expected them to, and as of right now we have a healthy surplus. To ensure that we end our fiscal year on a positive note we need everyone to fulfill their annual commitment, and our Board of Directors are planning some fundraisers that will help us exceed our budgetary goals.

One thing that has helped our 2018/2019 Budget is the grant we received from Homeland Security. I'm currently working to utilize the funds for a variety of projects that will enhance our security at Temple. I have been in contact with our contractors and scheduling to have video surveillance equipment installed and operating by the end of February. Replacing the doors is a much larger project that should be completed by June of 2019. I will continue to update you as these projects move forward.



Lastly, at our January Board of Directors meeting it was decided that we hire an off-duty police officer to be present at our Family Shabbat Services and at any event where we anticipate 50 or more people in attendance including Passover Seder. We are very much committed to ensuring a safe and secure environment for our congregants and guests and will continue to assess security regularly. Please don't hesitate to reach out to me with any questions or concerns. 2019 is shaping up to be a very good year here at the Temple and I hope it will be a good year for all of you as well.
