Rabbi's Message

The Elephant In The Room

The point of the expression, talking about the elephant in the room, is that we would rather not talk about it, but it is difficult to ignore it when there's an elephant in the room. There are a lot of things I would rather write about in this column, but, at this point, to ignore it can make it bigger and weightier until the real question becomes, is he really going to pretend that the elephant isn't here?

I am not going to pretend the elephant isn't here. In part because that's not my temperament, and also because I hold myself to the standard of being honest, and facing, rather than ignoring, difficult issues. In that spirit, I will be explicit that I am talking about the fact that the former rabbi of this congregation is now serving a prison sentence for criminal sexual behavior. Despite the fact that during his seventeen years of service to this congregation he never engaged in any untoward behavior, the facts of his actions and incarceration are a lot to process.

Some people are looking at the signature on their *ketubah* or conversion certificate, at the confirmation photos on our wall, and struggling with how to feel about or deal with it. Some are wondering if every memory and memento needs to be reinterpreted through the lens of later actions — does who he became reveal who he always was?

To be clear, not everyone feels the need to discuss or process this, and even among those who do, they are not necessarily grappling with these questions.

But for those of us in leadership positions at B'nai Jeshurun, we have had more than enough opportunity to talk about it. It makes sense that others would like to have that opportunity as well.



When something shocking brings dissonance into our lives, many of us have a very reasonable need to process it through conversation. Sometimes we need to talk about a thing in order to figure out how to think about it, or even so we can stop thinking about it. At some point in the very near future, we plan to facilitate such an opportunity.

Congregational President Dana Dickson and I have been consulting with advisors at our movement's umbrella organization, the Union for Reform Judaism, and discussing what this conversation should look like. We want it to be a fitting, productive, and helpful opportunity for those who want to participate. We will keep you all posted when we are ready with details.

When you've got an elephant in the room, it's tempting to throw a blanket over it and pretend it's a couch. It's an easy approach, but not an effective or honest one. The only way to get the elephant out of the room is to acknowledge its presence and then deal with it. Well, we have an elephant in the room, so let's start dealing with it.

President's Comments

The other day, I had a most interesting conversation with a friend and fellow congregant. We reflected on the past few years of COVID and found ourselves discussing the days of lockdown, severe social distancing, and our mental health as we reemerge into society. During the worst days of COVID — and there were so many — we went into survival mode. We simply had to get through each day, and then the next, with the hope that it would eventually end and we could go back to some semblance of a life we had once known.

Now that the stringent rules have lifted, we have (more or less) come out of seclusion. We are discovering that the world has changed, and so have we. We have had to rediscover what it means to rejoin society with civility. Many of the niceties of the “before times” have been left behind. Think about driving on University Avenue or downtown during rush hour. No more polite hand waves while changing lanes. Forget to signal and beware the horn. Drivers are frustrated and easily roused; impatient and intolerant of one another. How do we slow down, relax and return to each other with kindness, patience and tolerance?

Not only have we, the congregants of Temple B’nai Jeshurun, had to live with the stressors and complexities of COVID, but we have also experienced major changes as our community transitioned from Rabbi David Kaufman to our interim year with Rabbi Art Nemitoff and finally, to our new, settled rabbi, Rabbi Neal Schuster. That’s a tremendous amount of change in a short period of time. We, the board, asked all of you (who were simply trying to survive each day) to please be patient, kind and open-minded through this process — and you were. And the support was incredible, and we are grateful. As we continue to settle into all that

is new, we ask that you continue to possess and practice these behaviors and strengths.



We are quickly approaching Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur with Rabbi Neal leading our High Holy Days for the first time. While some of the music and parts of services may be new or different, most should feel familiar and comfortable to you, including the voices of our talented musicians who have enriched our services for many years. We have also been fortunate to welcome many new congregants to our Temple this year. Some of the faces you see may be brand new. Please welcome our new members (and our long-standing members) with warmth and audacious hospitality. As we continue to run virtual services and in-person services, and ask our staff to wear multiple hats, you may see board members and volunteers taking on new roles around the Temple, perhaps looking in all the wrong places for a linen napkin or duct tape. Everything we are experiencing together is novel.

The world has changed, and so have we. Change can be difficult and uncomfortable. Sometimes it’s good to take a beat, a breath, or a moment to meditate, and then draw upon those values of kindness, patience, and open-mindedness.

We have achieved many incredible goals in the last few years. We have so much to be proud of. We have exciting work ahead, as we continue to shape and reshape the promising and vibrant future of Temple B’nai Jeshurun. Together, let’s make the coming year, 5783, a year of growth, meaning, and blessing.

As many of you have likely heard, our Facility Manager, Charles Stanton, and his wife Amanda are expecting their seventh child, and by the time you are reading this that child will have arrived. At the time I am writing this, the birth hasn't happened yet so I can't give you any details, but make sure to wish him Mazel Tov the next time you see him.

Charles will be back with us for the High Holidays, and it will be all hands on deck, as this will be the first High Holidays since 2019 that we will be gathering with no restrictions. Though there will be no restrictions on the number of people who can attend, and masks will continue to be optional, as always, we ask that you use your best judgement before joining us. IF YOU ARE SICK, PLEASE STAY HOME. Even as more vaccines for COVID-19 become available we know that it can still be very serious for our vulnerable members, and we don't want to spread Covid or any other diseases this High Holidays.

We continue to have masks available for anyone who wants one, hand sanitizer will be placed throughout the building, and we will continue to use our portable air purifiers to create as safe of an environment as possible. If you do not feel comfortable joining us inside, we will once again have a tent set up outside and stream the services in the tent.

As always, we want as many of our members as possible to join for the High Holidays, but we recognize that a two hour plus service can be a bit much for our youngest members. To that end we will once

again be offering babysitting throughout the High Holidays.

We will have two rooms for babysitting; our childcare room will be for children 6 and under, and the youth lounge will be open for children 7 and up.

If you know in advance that you will want to take advantage of the babysitting, please contact Erin or me in the office.



Lastly, we want you to know that we are doing everything we can to create a secure environment here at the Temple. Over the past six months our Temple staff and several of our members have received training from law enforcement officials and emergency personnel on how to handle myriad situations. In addition to that we will have five off-duty police officers on site for the High Holidays, and we will have additional staff helping with our audio-visual needs so that Charles and I will be available to deal with other situations as they arise.

I hope that you can tell that we have been hard at work to create a safe and secure environment, and we want everyone who joins us for the High Holidays to feel welcomed and comfortable. I hope to see you in September and wish you all Shana Tova.

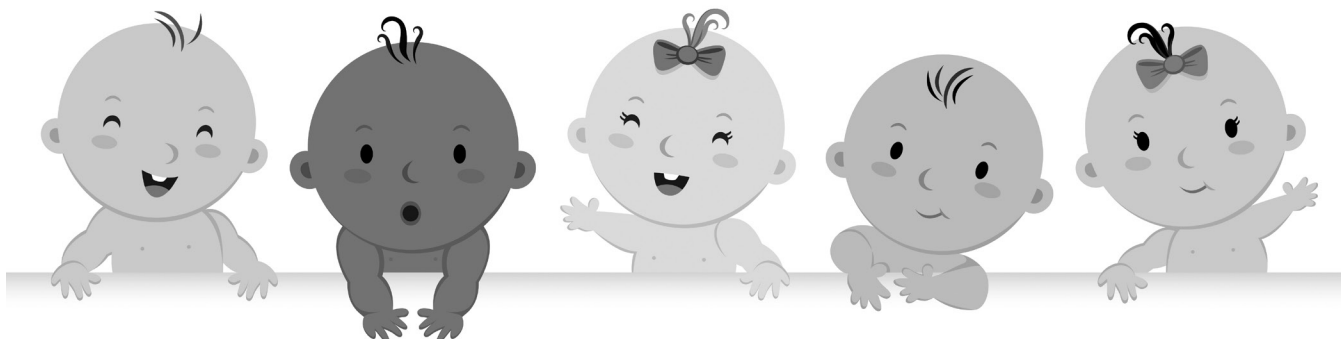

The DMARC Food Pantry Network, established in 1976, consists of 14 partner pantry sites, 20+ Mobile Food Pantry sites, a no-contact delivery service, and numerous community partners. It is the largest and oldest food pantry system in Iowa. Pantry sites are located in West Des Moines, Ankeny, Johnston, Clive and Urbandale, with nine sites in Des Moines.

Once per calendar month, families can receive a free, three-day supply of nutritionally balanced food. It's not enough for us to just fill stomachs, we want to provide nourishing food to those we assist. Families can also receive additional 'Anytime Items' every day at pantries. Last year, DMARC assisted nearly 40,000 individuals facing food insecurity in Greater Des Moines.

Yom Kippur Interlude: Wednesday, October 5 at 1:30 p.m.

During the High Holidays, we focus on teshuvah. Often understood as “repentance” or “atonement,” teshuvah literally means “return.” Jewish legend teaches that before God created this universe of multiplicity, God created teshuvah, a healing force embedded in all creation that draws all things back to their source in infinite oneness. In this Interlude, we will reflect on how we have been impacted by the many disruptive and disturbing events of the past few years and consider how our tradition’s teachings about teshuvah can help us to move toward integration, reconciliation and wholeness as individuals and as a community.

Our conversation will be facilitated by Christine Dietz, Ph.D., D.Min., L.I.S.W, a licensed independent social worker and spiritual director. She is a graduate of the Lev Shomea Training Program for Spiritual Direction in the Jewish Tradition and teaches and practices spiritually integrated psychotherapy to people from all religious and spiritual traditions. She is a member of Tifereth Israel Synagogue.
