President's Message

Dear Temple Members,


L'Shanah Tovah! It was a pleasure to reconnect with familiar members, welcome new faces and new members, and participate in the traditions and events that define our Temple community throughout our Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, and Simchat Torah services and celebrations. As this period of reflection and renewal concludes, I want to extend my gratitude for everyone's dedication and ongoing support of our wonderful Temple community.

Community— Kehillah in Hebrew continues to be an important aspect of our tradition. Our Torah portion, Nitzavim, describes Moses addressing the Israelites to renew their covenant with God, highlighting collective significance of faith, responsibility, and commitment within the Jewish community. I believe our Temple community embodies this covenant through facilitating opportunities for Jewish learning and spiritual growth, supporting members during life cycle events, and prioritizing the sustainability of the congregation for future generations, the latter of which, I believe, should be the central focus of Temple leadership. As president of our Temple's board since July, my past few months have been spent in many meetings (many meetings) learning about and discussing our budgeting and accounting practices, our endowment, our administrative operations, and our member engagement, with a focus on strategic planning, and I want to provide you all with an overview of recent developments and initiatives undertaken by our Temple leadership over the past several months.

This past year, we experienced impactful staffing changes when David Muenchrath resigned as Executive Director after 13 years, and Wendy Beckerman retired as our B'nai Mitzvah Coordinator after more than 38 years. The transition following David's and Wendy's departures led Erin Plank (our Director of Administration), Charles Stanton (our Director of Maintenance and Facilities), and Shaynna Grund (our new Director of Programming and Communications) to take on new and expanded responsibilities this

past summer. Their efforts have been supported by ongoing meetings and continued collaboration with Rabbi Neal, me, Brad Goldman (our board's treasurer) and many of our board members.

During this period of transition, our



- Accounting and Budgeting Enhancements. Brad has facilitated a comprehensive review of our accounting and budgeting practices which has identified opportunities for increased efficiency and accuracy.
- Software and Payroll System Updates. Brad has led initiatives to update our Temple software and payroll systems which will be rolled out over the next several months to improve our overall administrative operations. Our new cloud-based software system is called EasyShul which, among other features, will allow our members to manage their own accounts, pay dues and make donations, sign up for Temple events and Yahrzeit reminders, and receive additional Temple communications.
- Building Updates and Maintenance. Thanks to Rabbi Neal, Shaynna, and Charles, our Old Chapel (on the northside of our sanctuary) has been repurposed as a warm and inviting space for families who may need a space for their children during services or a gathering place for families preparing for weddings and funerals. In addition, our roofing systems need major repair. Patchwork fixes have been made over the years, but Charles reports that four roofing companies have inspected the roof, and all companies concluded that it is well past the time to replace all our roofing systems. As

you may know, we've been experiencing significant leaks throughout the building after severe weather events over the past several years. The replacement of our building's roofing system is essential to the safety and integrity of our building. Please note that our roof replacement project is scheduled to begin in the last week of October.

- Building Security. Ken Scarlette, a veteran law enforcement officer from Illinois, is our Jewish community's new Regional Security Advisor with the Iowa-Illinois Secure Community Network (SCN). For those unfamiliar with the SCN, it was established in 2004 as the designated security organization for the North American Jewish Community and serves as the official liaison between the Jewish community and federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. Ken and his team conducted a comprehensive threat, vulnerability, and risk assessment of our Temple facility this past summer. SCN is currently evaluating our existing security policies and infrastructure, and we are awaiting their report with recommendations on any necessary updates to ensure the continued safety and well-being of our community.
- Caring Community. Wendy Beckerman, our new Caring Committee Vision Leader on the board, now holds a title that reflects her longstanding dedication to her ongoing acts of chesed within our community. Her many contributions include visiting ill members, providing transportation to medical appointments, supplying meals, and she is building a community of volunteers to help her. Most recently, she worked in collaboration with our Federation and Tifereth to organize and participate in Rosh Hashanah food deliveries for seniors and homebound members of our Jewish community.
- Membership. Wendi Harris, our Membership Vision Leader, reports that our membership numbers continue to increase over the past three years, and she is working with Shaynna to plan welcoming events aimed at fostering increased engagement among our new members.
- Fundraising. Edye Beckerman, our Fundraising Vision Leader, will be launching a
 comprehensive fundraising campaign designed to support our Temple's vision and
 ensure its long-term sustainability. This initiative not only addresses our ongoing financial
 needs but also invites every member of our community to be involved—whether through
 volunteering, attending events, or making financial contributions.

We have set ambitious goals for our Temple: upgrading the building for safety, implementing new software to improve our operations and engagement, strengthening our financial practices, and fostering our Temple and community connections. As always, we are committed to transparency, accountability, and ongoing improvements. But we can't do any of this without you. We need your support, your time, your skills, and your financial contributions. As we continue to grow, let's keep building on the strong foundation we've set honoring what makes our Temple community special. I believe that our shared promise—our covenant—really brings us together us as we celebrate our Jewish values, support each other, and uphold and honor our traditions.

On behalf of myself, my husband Joel, my growing family, and our Temple Board, I wish you all a Happy and Healthy 5786 that brings you new beginnings, new blessings, and a deeper sense of connection to our Temple community.




